

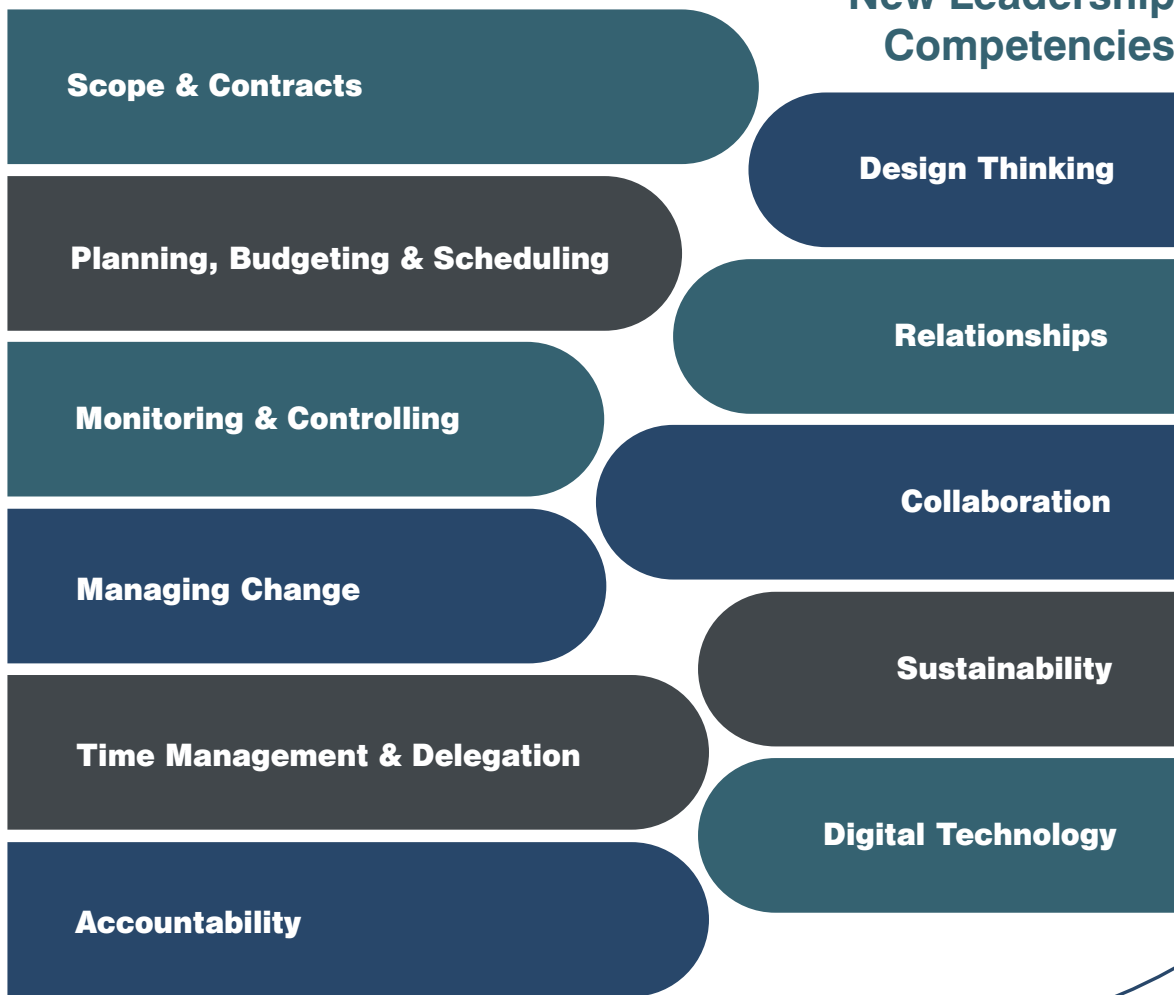

Task Management for Design Firm Professionals

A two-day course focused on the development of critical management skills for task managers in architecture, engineering, and design firms.
